The National Institute of Development Administration (NIDA) is accepting enrollment applications for the Doctor of Philosophy Program in Governance and Development. Applications are accepted between July 8th– July 25th, 2024.

1. Applicant Qualifications

1.1 As a minimum qualifications applicants must hold a master's degree in any field from a university accredited by the Civil Service Commission of the Royal Thai Government.

1.2 Applicants who have graduated from a university outside of Thailand must obtain a Letter of Confirmation on Standard Curriculum for Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree from the Commission on Higher Education at the Ministry of Education. This letter can be obtained by submitting a request along with required documents directly to the Bureau of Standards and Evaluation (8th floor) at the Commission on Higher Education, Ministry of Education: 328 Sri Ayutthaya Rd., Ratchathewi District, Bangkok 10400; 0-2354-5577, 0-2610-5381-2

1.3 Applicants must be proficient in communicating with English throughout the program. English language proficiency must be attested through official TOEFL (<https://www.ets.org/toefl/>), or IELTS (<https://www.ielts.org/>) scores. In addition to official ETS TOEFL scores, NIDA accepts only TOEFL ITP scores from GSLC at NIDA: NIDA Graduate School of Language and Communication (GSLC) Siam Boromrajakumari Building, 13th Floor. 148 Seri-Thai Rd., Klong Chan, Bangkapi, Bangkok 10240 (Contact Mr. Phanuwat Phumisart at 0-2727-3142 or phanuw.p@nida.ac.th for further information).

Applicants may be admitted into the program according to the following plans:

Plan 1: Applicants submit application documents including official test scores that meet the following criteria:

- TOEFL (TOEFL ITP) 550 or above (testing only at GSLC NIDA); or
- TOEFL (TOEFL iBT) 79 or above; or
- IELTS 6.5 or above; or

(Test scores must not be older than 2 years at the time of submission.)

- Graduated with a master's degree from an international educational institution where English is the medium of instruction. The master's degree must not be more than 5 years old in the first semester of student registration. Additionally, the applicant's master degree average (4.00 system) must not be less than 3.25.

Students who applied through plan 1 are exception from enrollment in the additional English language courses according to NIDA regulations.

Plan 2: Applicants submit application documents including official test scores that fall into the following criteria:

- TOEFL (TOEFL ITP) 500 or above (testing only at GSLC NIDA); or
- TOEFL (TOEFL iBT) 71 or above; or
- IELTS 5.5 or above; or

(Test scores must not be older than 2 years at the time of submission.)

- Graduated with a master's degree from an international educational institution where English is the medium of instruction. The master's degree must not be more than 5 years old in the first semester of student registration. The applicant's master degree average (4.00 system) has grade point average below 3.25

Remark: Students who applied through plan 2 are required to enroll in 2 additional English language courses (non-credit) according to NIDA regulations. Students are further required to submit official English language proficiency test scores before their dissertation defense. Scores accepted as follows:

- TOEFL (TOEFL ITP) 550 or above (testing only at GSLC NIDA); or
- TOEFL (TOEFL iBT) 79 or above; or
- IELTS 6.5 or above; or
- NIDA EPT (English Proficiency Test) 650 or above

(Test scores must not be older than 2 years at the time of submission.)

The English Language course exemption.

The following applicants meet the requirements to not enroll in LC 4003 Advanced Reading and Writing in English for Graduate Studies and LC 4004 Advanced Integrated English Language Skills Development:

- Applicants who have been awarded master's degrees from international academic institutions where English was the medium of instruction and study. The master's degree must not be older than 5 years at the time of the first term of the student registration. In addition, the grade point average for the applicant's master's degree (4.00 system) must not be below 3.25; or

- Applicants who submit for the proficiency English test score of either 550 for TOEFL (TOEFL ITP), or TOEFL (TOEFL iBT) 79, or 6.5 for IELTS. English test scores must not be older than 2 years at the time of the first term of the student registration; or

- Proof of English proficiency by supplying evidence that applicants were born/or are citizens of a country where English is the primary language. The Proper documentation of proof is required.

NOTE: Applicants are responsible to check that application forms are complete and make sure that they qualify for admission as announced above. Applicants whose application documents are incomplete or who do not meet the required qualifications will not be considered for admission and may be expelled at any time if found to be in violation of the above qualifications. Any fees paid are non-refundable.

2. Application Procedures

Applicants using bank transfer are required to attach proof of payment (copy of transfer order) to their application documents. The completed application must be received by the Division during office hours (8:30-16:30 hours) no later than July 25th, 2024.

2.3 Online application is only available at <http://entrance.nida.ac.th>. The application fee of 1,300 Baht; non-refundable; should be made within July 25th, 2024 at Bangkok Bank or Counter Service. Applicants using bank transfer are required to attach evidence of payment (copy of transfer order) to their application documents. The application documents must be submitted along with the application fee receipt.





7,000 Baht per credit hour. Total fees for the entire program are approximately 500,000 Baht.


